## Sea Changes: Your Community Boatyard Turns 10

After a passionate community movement to save Eddon Boatyard and its traditional uses, Gig Harbor BoatShop was established in 2008. We moved into a freshly restored Eddon Boatyard in 2010 and threw open our doors to the public.

During the last ten years, we have engaged thousands of people with Gig Harbor's working waterfront. We have invited locals and visitors to join us in a real working boat shop where real boats are actually built. We

have educated the young and the old on skills ranging from woodworking to tying knots to diesel engine repair. We have told stories, sang songs, celebrated our past, and planned for our future. We have championed the preservation and restoration of the Eddon Boatyard components, piece by piece.

We have restored and maintained boats ranging from canoes to a 63' commercial fishing vessel. We have taught people how to sail, how to row, and how to steer boats. We have bent wood, cast bronze, and pretty much everything in between. We have recruited students to participate in our internship programs, and we have recruited talented people to serve on our Board and as volunteers.

We have been the catalyst for authentic experiences for thousands of people that otherwise may not have the opportunity to climb aboard a historic boat, or step inside a historic boatyard. We provide a place for people to

gather, to create, and to make connections with each other and with their community.

And that's just the first ten years.

Why does this matter? Because with the onslaught of the digital age, there are fewer opportunities than ever before to make *stuff* – like boats. Because the work we do to interpret and operate a historic boatyard defines and protects the very essence of Gig Harbor so that our children and grandchildren will be able to enjoy it. And because, as author Wal-

lace Stegner wrote, "if you don't know where you are, you don't know who you are."

None of this would be possible without you. Gig Harbor BoatShop is an organization founded by a community and perpetuated by a community. Support from our friends and

neighbors comes in many forms: time (so much time!), money, tools, boats, expertise, and hundreds of other gifts. All are vital to the accomplishments of our first ten years. Thank you.

We intend to keep up the good work we began in 2008. This milestone has allowed us to renew our focus on strategic priorities like completing the boatyard restoration (just the marine railways and house remain), enhancing our communications, and increasing fundraising. Progress in any of these areas will directly result in even more public benefit. We ARE your community boatyard.

### MARINE RAILWAYS PROJECT BEGINS

A year after the Marine Railways Capital Campaign was launched, we raised enough money to purchase the steel for the outside rails. The steel was delivered and work began in early November.

This significant milestone is possible because of support from the City of Gig Harbor, TOTE Maritime Alaska, and private donors. Board treasurer John McMillan has also been instrumental to the project's progress.

There is still work to be done. We are fundraising for the last \$330,000 needed to complete the railways, which represents less than 5% of the total Eddon Boatyard purchase and restoration cost.





Steel for the outside railways was delivered to the site Nov. 1. Within a few days, BoatShop volunteers had made significant progress on the installation.

## All Ages Can Get Involved at the BoatShop

Kids that participate in BoatShop activities are doing more than just getting their hands dirty. They are activating the mind-hand connection, increasingly elusive in today's digital age. They are experiencing the simple joys of creating things and interacting with one another, face to face. They are engaging with Gig Harbor's working waterfront heritage and becoming more connected to their community. They are having fun!

We are deliberately investing in youth and family programs to ensure the next generation will have access to the resources the BoatShop provides to the public. Plus, kids thrive in this type of environment. We are thrilled when parents report the BoatShop brings out the best in their children.

Last academic year, we partnered with Peninsula School District to pilot **Young Hands** | **New Skills**, an internship program for Henderson Bay High School students. The program pairs student interns with boatwright Tom Regan and other BoatShop mentors in a master/apprentice setting. The pilot was so successful that the program was renewed and expanded for this academic year.

Children age five and up are invited to attend **Tales at the BoatShop**, a free story hour offered periodically throughout the year led by volunteer Cindy Hackett. Held in the historic Joiner Shop, participants soak up authentic boatyard heritage.

Year-round **BoatShop Adventures** sessions teach children to create a woodworking project of their own. This hands-on program is geared toward elementary-aged youth.

The popular Family Boat Building Program, supported by the Baker Foundation and Edensaw Woods, has built well over 200 boats. In 2019 the BoatShop will offer scholarships to families who otherwise may not have the opportunity to participate in a Family Boat Building weekend.

It's never too early to get kids on the water! Children of all ages are welcome to take a ride on the seasonal **BoatShop Livery** boats (thanks to the **Northwest Marine Trade Association's Grow Boating Program** for supporting the Livery) and to tour our historic purse seine vessel *Veteran*. Pack a picnic lunch and introduce your youngsters to the joy and delight of boats and boating.



## S/S Hyak Wheelhouse Replica Takes Shape



**Poulsbo Historical Society** needs a full-size replica of the steam ship *Hyak* wheel-house to serve as a permanent entrance at their Maritime Museum in downtown Poulsbo. The BoatShop happens to have a few wheelhouse experts (remember *Avalon?*). So when the Historical Society approached the BoatShop for help, we happily agreed to build the wheelhouse.

Volunteer Bill Isaacs is taking the lead on the project, which began in September. Bill is involved in every aspect, from material selection to construction means and methods.

When complete, the exact replica will be approximately 8' x 7'-6". People will be able to stand inside and turn the wheel. The *Hyak* was part of the Mosquito Fleet and operated

in Puget Sound from 1914 until 1936.

The wheelhouse project will be complete in spring 2019.
